Duties: Serves as a Military Planner and organizational expert on various geographic and subject areas including Information Operations (IO), Electronic Warfare (EW), Operations Security (OPSEC), Psychological Operations (PSYOPS), Deception, and Targeting. Conducts research and analysis on the capabilities of foreign forces to conduct information operations against U.S. ground forces and coalition forces in low to mid-level intensity conflicts environments. Conducts all-source research and undertakes applicable analysis of specific geographic areas. Applies comprehensive knowledge of threat analysis and other analytical methodologies to the assessment of IO and its threat to deployed U.S. and allied forces worldwide. Remains informed of military, political-military, scientific, and technical developments within assigned areas. Plans, coordinates, and synthesizes research undertaken by other government agencies and private sector organizations, then prepares tailored IO Support Packages.

- *Applicants claiming Veterans Preference must submit paperwork at the time of selection. Must be able to obtain and maintain a TOP SECRET Special Access Security Clearance as a result of current and favorable Special Background Investigation (SB*). *Specialized experience is comprehensive knowledge of the principles and concepts associated with foreign area analysis, order-of-battle analysis and its associated impact on IO psychological operations, battlefield deception, electronic warfare, and targeting for physical destruction; Comprehensive and detailed knowledge and understanding of the US Army and its component elements, as well as the organization and functions of the National Foreign Intelligence Community, the mission and functions of customer activities and the mission goals and objectives of the 1st IO Cmd; Knowledge of a wide range of research and collection methods, database extraction techniques, and analytical applications.

- GG-12 and above: One year of specialized experience directly related to the position being filled and equivalent to the next lower grade level. There is no substitution of education for experience at this level.
- Progressively responsible experience is that which has included intelligence-related research, analysis, collections and /or operations. At the GS-11 level and above it should have included intelligence analysis and/or production, intelligence collection and/or operations, counterintelligence, or threat support directly related to the position to be filled. Creditable specialized experience may include previous military intelligence experience, experience gained in the private sector or in another government agency as long as it was at a level at least equivalent to the next lower grade in the series. This experience should demonstrate: Knowledge of intelligence processes, cycle and organizations; Knowledge of and/or ability to use research tools such as library holdings, photographs, statistics, graphics and maps; Knowledge of the systems, procedures and methods of analyzing, compiling, reporting and disseminating intelligence data; and/or Knowledge of organization(s) for and methods of collecting and analyzing intelligence data.
