Duties: Serves as organizational expert on various geographic and subject areas including Information Operations (IO), Electronic Warfare (EW), Operations Security (OPSEC), Psychological Operations (PSYOPS), Deception, and Targeting. Conducts research and analysis and undertakes applicable analysis on the capabilities of foreign forces to conduct information operations against U.S. ground forces and coalition forces. Serves as a project leader on complex research studies. Provides professional advice and techniques employed in the conduct of IO, using in-depth knowledge of foreign area analysis in the completion of IO target nominations. Plans, coordinates, and synthesizes research undertaken by other government agencies and private sector organizations, then prepares tailored Information Operations Support Packages. Briefs intelligence assessments with the Army staff, senior commanders, and the National Foreign Intelligence Community.

- Applicants claiming Veterans? Preference must submit required paperwork at the time of selection. Must be able to acquire and maintain a TOP SECRET Special Access security clearance as a result of a favorable Special Background Investigation (SBI). Temporary duty to worldwide locations may constitute up to 25% of the time. Specialized experience is knowledge of the principles and concepts associated with foreign area analysis and order-of-battle analysis. Knowledge of research and collection methods, data base extraction techniques and analytical applications. Ability to conduct briefings and discussions with senior leadership in an operational environment. Must possess skills to author major study reports at departmental staff level.
- GG-12 and above: One year of specialized experience directly related to the position being filled and equivalent to the next lower grade level. There is no substitution of education for experience at this level.
- Progressively responsible experience is that which has included intelligence-related research, analysis, collections and /or operations. At the GS-11 level and above it should have included

intelligence analysis and/or production, intelligence collection and/or operations, counterintelligence, or threat support directly related to the position to be filled. Creditable specialized experience may include previous military intelligence experience, experience gained in the private sector or in another government agency as long as it was at a level at least equivalent to the next lower grade in the series. This experience should demonstrate: Knowledge of intelligence processes, cycle and organizations; Knowledge of and/or ability to use research tools such as library holdings, photographs, statistics, graphics and maps; Knowledge of the systems, procedures and methods of analyzing, compiling, reporting and disseminating intelligence data; and/or Knowledge of organization(s) for and methods of collecting and analyzing intelligence data.
